OUR VISION:

SAVING LIVES, ONE LIFE CENTER AT A TIME

The Work of Our Life Centers

Our Life Centers provide a safe, judgment-free space for women experiencing a crisis pregnancy. Soon-to-be moms receive relational resources, material support, and encouragement.



LEARN & EARN

Future and young mothers train to receive baby/personal care knowledge, domestic financial management skills, and spiritual counseling. Points earned through classes can be redeemed to purchase baby and household items.



POST ABORTION HEALING

Women participate in a specially designed course called "Forgiven and Set Free" and partner with support groups to encourage hearts broken by abortion to find healing and God's grace.



STUDENT PROGRAMS

We partner with local high schools to bring entertaining, interactive, and informative programming to secular students who oftentimes haven't considered the sanctity of life and the value of abstinence.



THREADS OF HOPE

This program helps families who have experienced the tragedy of the premature loss of a baby. The course provides healing in overcoming depression, restoring trust, and strengthening family relationships.



Natalia's Story

For the Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.” Psalm 34:18

For a long time, Natalia watched from a distance. She followed the Life Center quietly on social media, never commenting, never reaching out. Late at night, she read other women's stories. She looked at photos from group meetings of women sitting in circles, holding warm cups of tea, listening, learning, being surrounded by care. She noticed the gentle words of encouragement in the comments and the way people spoke with kindness and dignity. It felt like a small island of warmth that was real, hopeful; but somehow meant for someone else.

The day she called us, her voice sounded thin and exhausted, as if she had not slept in days. She was pregnant with her third child. She was the only one working since her husband had just lost his job. The money they relied on was disappearing, and fear started to take its place.

Then she said the words that were hard for her to admit out loud. She didn't want to give birth. She decided she would have an abortion.

Before making that call, Natalia had gone to her gynecologist, hoping for understanding, possibly someone who would slow her racing thoughts and see the fear behind her decision. Instead, she was met with cold rejection as her doctor told her "I won't do this. Go wherever you want." She walked out of the office with a heaviness in her chest that felt impossible to carry. In that moment, standing alone with her thoughts filled with fear, Natalia remembered our Life Center. She remembered the page she had followed secretly, the stories she read so she wouldn't have to face her own, the support she believed was meant for others but not her...but she decided to pick up the phone and call.

A meeting was scheduled for that same day. By God's quiet and perfect timing, the first group meeting for pregnant women was about to begin within the hour. Natalia arrived right on time but her shoulders were tense, Her eyes were clearly tired, and she was bracing for disappointment. During the conversation, everything poured out about how her mother insisted that a third child was unnecessary. Her husband had said, "Do whatever you want," and emotionally stepped away.

She was only four weeks pregnant and already overwhelmed with shame, fear, exhaustion, and the crushing belief that she simply could not do this.

On the table by her lay materials for our educational meetings. One of the volunteers gently reached for a tiny grain of wheat and placed it carefully in Natalia's open palm. It was so small she almost didn't feel it. Softly she said: "This is about the size of your baby right now. There is already a heart beating. A liver forming blood. This is already life."

"Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you." Jeremiah 1:5

Sometimes people don't need lectures or statistics or someone telling them what they should do. They need a moment where someone sees them as a human being who is hurting. Someone who chooses to speak gently, clearly, without judgment. Simply truth wrapped in compassion.

Natalia was told something simple, but life-changing: You are not alone. If diapers were the concern, they would help. If fear overwhelmed her, they would walk beside her. If loneliness felt unbearable, they would stay. She didn't have to carry this by herself anymore. She was invited to stay for the group meeting and she agreed. The first weeks Natalia barely spoke. She sat carefully, as if afraid of taking up too much space. Tears filled her eyes from beginning to end of each meeting. The hardest moments came during lessons about motherhood, child development, and conception. When the educational dolls were brought out, she turned away and cried.

It felt as though two truths were fighting inside her: fear on one side, and a mother's heart on the other. A heart that hadn't yet dared to believe it had permission to love. But she came back, week after week. She didn't speak much, but she showed up.

Then came the twelfth week. Natalia arrived and quietly said the words, almost in disbelief:

"Already twelve." Something had shifted. The decision had already been made, even if she hadn't spoken it out loud yet. There would be no abortion. She would give birth.

"There is hope for your future," declares the Lord. Jeremiah 31:17

Later, she learned she was carrying her third son. And for the first time, alongside fear, something else appeared; joy. Careful, quiet, fragile...but real.

In December, Natalia gave birth to a healthy baby boy. In January 2026, he turned one month old.

She is now recovering after childbirth and writes of her gratitude and desire to return to the Life Center meetings, because it was there, she first felt what it means to be seen without judgment, supported without pressure, and loved without condition.

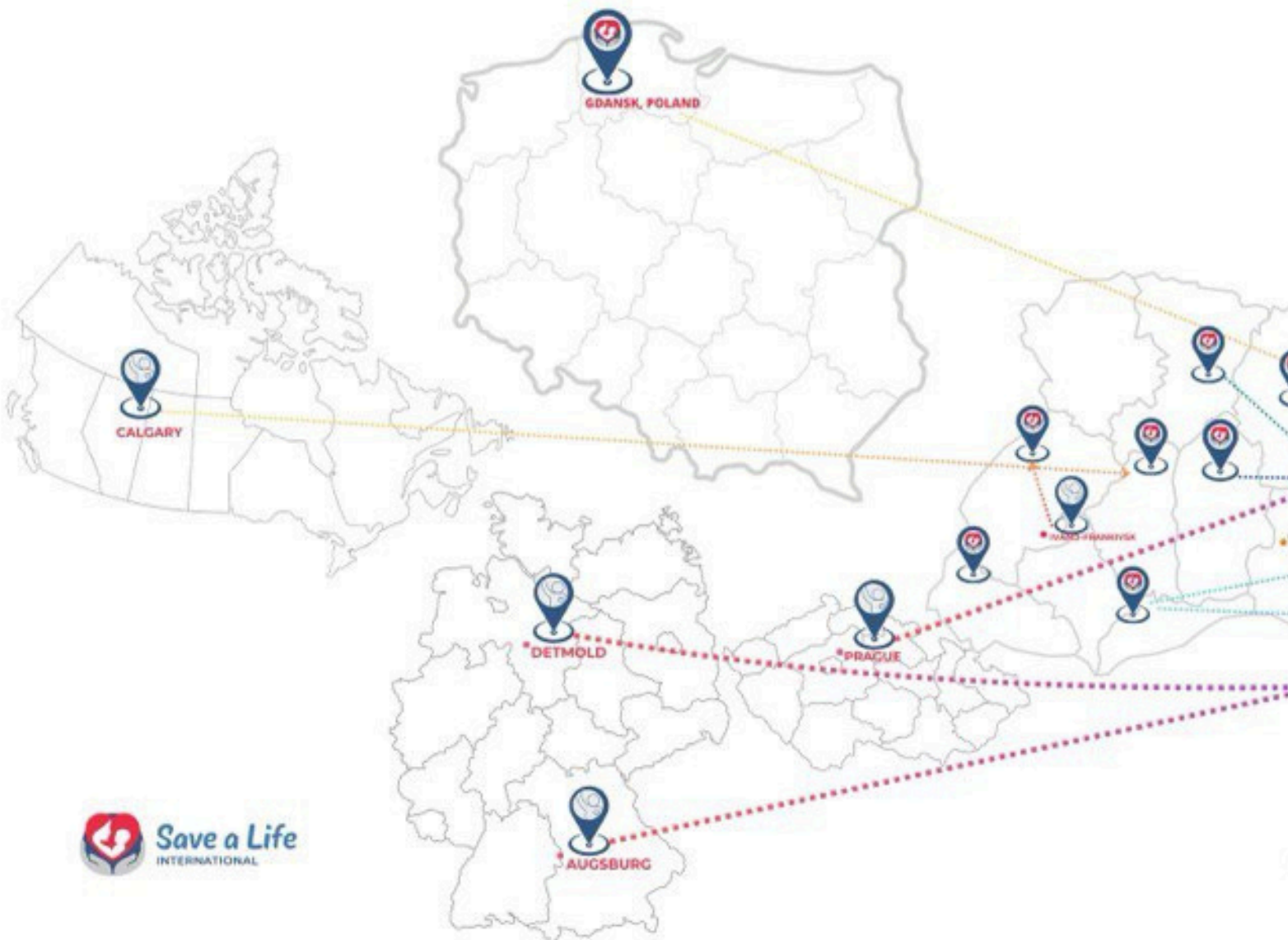

“LEARN & EARN” — ONLINE SUPPORT FOR MOTHERS ACROSS UKRAINE

These are weekly online groups for pregnant women and mothers with babies under one year.

We talk about childcare, women's health, financial planning, and emotional and spiritual support.

Mothers earn points for their active participation, which can be exchanged for baby products and essential items.

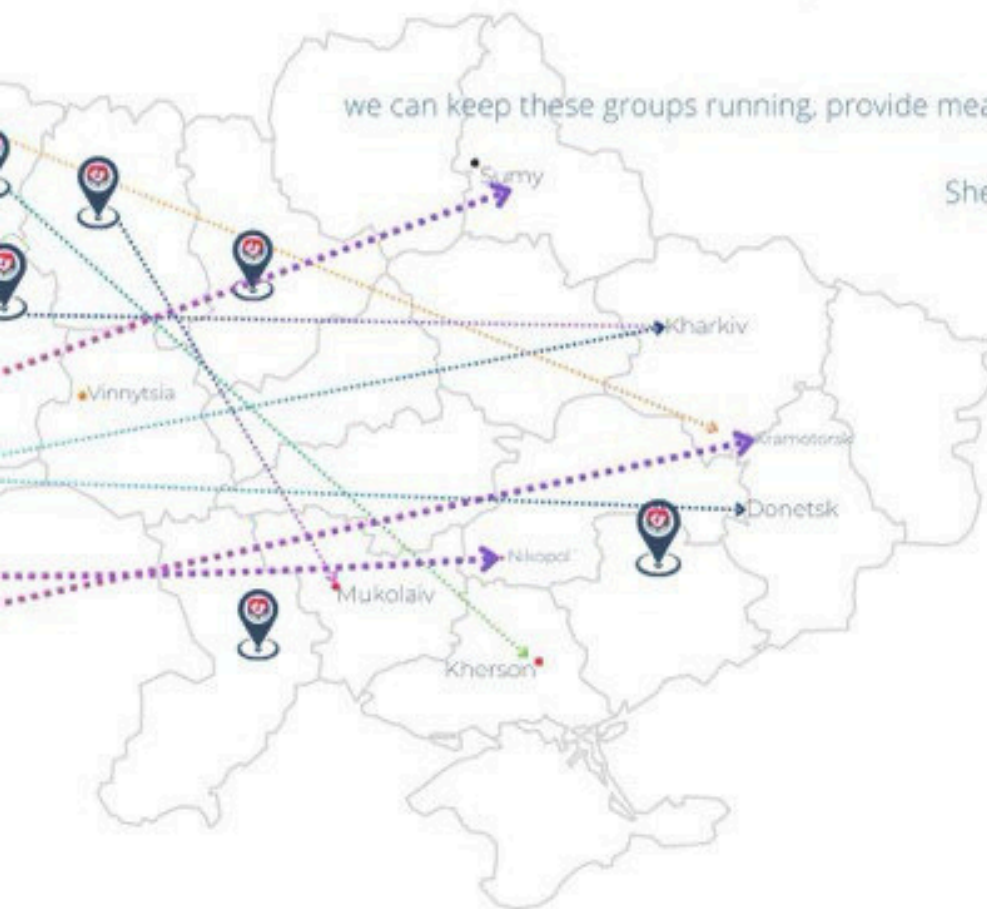
This format is new for us. It first began during the COVID-19 pandemic, when in-person meetings became impossible. But it truly expanded during the war — when distance, danger, and displacement separated us physically, but not in heart.

Today, our volunteers who fled abroad due to the war — to Canada, Germany, the Czech Republic, and the USA — remain deeply involved. They continue to lead online groups and faithfully support moms from cities like Kramatorsk, Vinnytsia, Ivano-Frankivsk, and others.

This is more than training. It's connection, community, and care — across borders.

Thanks to your support, we can keep these groups running, provide meaningful gifts and supplies, and ensure every woman knows: She is not alone. She is seen. She is supported.

Our Hands and Feet In The Field

I was born and raised in Russia. From the outside, it looked like an ordinary childhood, but when I was 13, everything changed abruptly: my parents divorced. My mother, who is Ukrainian, decided to return to her homeland, but first she sent me alone to my grandmother. She didn't come for another six months. A new country, a different language, relatives who felt like strangers, a new school... and no one who was truly close. I cried in the evenings, withdrew into myself, and hardly had any friends at school. When my mother finally arrived, our relationship was complicated, so the pain and loneliness only grew. After finishing school, I went to study accounting, and within the first days after graduating, I got a job. I was happy to finally earn my own money and not depend on relatives. But I had nowhere to live, and I desperately wanted to escape the house that never felt like home. That's when I met a man older than me. He seemed reliable, mature, someone who could protect me. He immediately suggested that I move in with him, and I agreed without even thinking it through. I noticed the first warning signs at the beginning of living together: raised voices, insults... Yet I pretended not to see them. I just didn't want to go back to the place where I always felt unwanted. Soon I became pregnant, and from that moment on, I simply surrendered to circumstances. My daughter was born and with the joy of motherhood came betrayal, aggression, beatings, and humiliation. He manipulated me, and I, naive, believed he would change someday. Fear held me captive to the point that I started thinking this was my life, my sentence. In 2014, at a new job, I met a girl who was kind, different. Later I learned she was a Christian. She would sometimes tell me about God, invite me to her church for Christmas, support me, and listen to the stories of my home where there was no peace. In 2018, I found out I was pregnant again. I dreamed of a big family, but not with this man, not in this pain. My first thought was abortion. And that was the moment when God intervened gently, but powerfully. The next day, I met my Christian friend, who by then was already serving with Save a Life. She invited me to a meeting. After the very first visit, my life began to change. I started attending the program meetings, and then Bible lessons. For the first time, I began truly getting to know God.

My son was born as a true gift from God. Holding him, I believed he could save our family. I prayed for my husband, hoping for a miracle. In the summer of 2020, I repented and accepted Christ into my heart, and that fall, I was baptized. But things at home did not improve. In fact, they got worse. I saw the environment in which my daughter was growing up. I saw how this was shaping the character of my son. And then one day the final line was crossed: my husband hit me so hard that my nose started bleeding... and my little boy was sitting in my arms, with drops falling onto him. At that moment, I realized: if I don't escape now, tomorrow may be too late. I reached out to the director of Save a Life. And they helped me secretly, at night, with my children, to flee to another part of the country. I've now been living here for almost five years. Here, I serve and work at Save a Life as an administrator. Even when I was their client, I dreamed of being part of this organization, and God fulfilled that dream.

Why do I want to help women?

Because I know what fear feels like. What hopelessness feels like. What the silence after beatings sounds like, and the laughter of children who learn to hide their mother's tears. When a woman in crisis comes to us I understand her. I have something to say to her. Something to share. And I have a faith that can change her life, just as it changed mine. Over these years, God has changed me deeply. He has taught me to love people, to care, to support, to serve. He has shown me that even the darkest story can become light for others. And now, a new chapter has begun in my life. I've met a man with whom I dream of building a strong, Christian family. I believe he is God's gift and part of God's plan. I want to follow Him faithfully. And I want my life to testify that with God, there are no hopeless stories. There is only a journey, from darkness to hope.



WAR IN UKRAINE CONTINUES

Over the past four years, Ukraine has continued to face one of the gravest demographic crises in its modern history. In 2024 alone, **176,679 babies were born**, while **495,090 people died**. This is a staggering **three deaths for every birth**, according to national civil registration data.

This imbalance reflects both the long-standing decline in fertility and the devastating effects of the ongoing war. Since the full-scale invasion in 2022, Ukraine's population has fallen to an estimated **39.4 million**, representing a loss of nearly **10 million people** due to displacement, migration, and war-related deaths. Verified civilian casualties continue to rise, with the United Nations reporting **at least 14,500 civilians killed** and tens of thousands injured as of late 2025, numbers widely acknowledged as **significant undercounts** because many areas remain inaccessible.

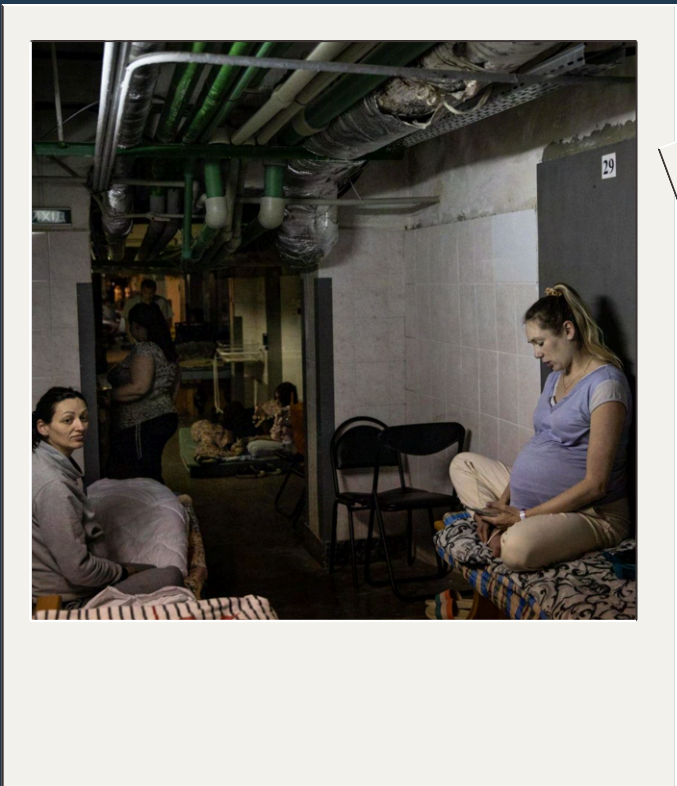
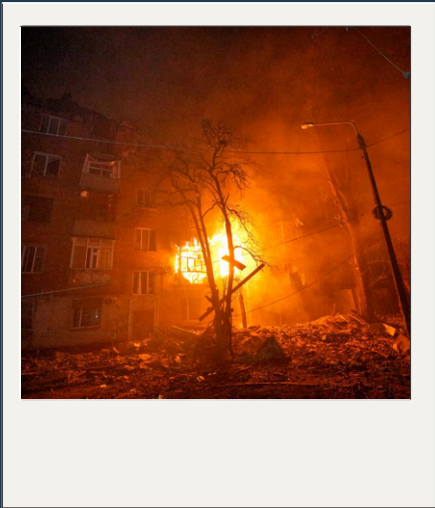
Experts warn that if current trends persist with declining birthrates, elevated mortality, and continued displacement, Ukraine could face long-term population collapse, with profound social and economic consequences for generations. Yet even in these conditions, families continue to bring new life into the world, and our organizations works tirelessly to support mothers, babies, and communities enduring unimaginable hardship.

A Decade of Life, Hope, and Kingdom Impact At Save a Life International

Over the past decade, Save a Life International has faithfully stood at the intersection of **crisis and compassion**, answering the call of Scripture to “defend the weak and the fatherless; uphold the cause of the poor and the oppressed” (Psalm 82:3). What began with the vision to support women facing unplanned pregnancies and to educate youth on the sanctity of life has grown into a **multifaceted ministry spanning Ukraine, Poland, and the United States**.

At the heart of SALI’s work are its **Life Centers**; bright, welcoming, judgment-free spaces where women experience practical care, emotional support, spiritual encouragement, and tangible resources for motherhood. These centers walk alongside women long before birth, and long after, reflecting Jesus’ tender heart for every mother and child (Luke 1:41–44).

As war broke out in Ukraine in 2022, SALI’s mission expanded to meet urgent needs that no one could have predicted. Life Centers pivoted to also provide **humanitarian relief to refugees and families displaced by conflict**. In regions once filled with routine counseling and parent-training programs, volunteers and staff began distributing food, clothing, and life-sustaining aid to those fleeing violence, embodying Christ’s command to “love your neighbor as yourself” (Mark 12:31).

Over the last decade, SALI’s programs have also emphasized **education and prevention**, bringing engaging presentations on sexual integrity and the intrinsic value of every life to young people who might not otherwise encounter these truths. These efforts are rooted in the belief that every life is made in the image of God (Genesis 1:27) and worth celebrating.

The organization’s leadership, including founder **Nadia Gordynsky**, whose heart for women in crisis and pro-life advocacy has shaped SALI’s vision, and a growing team of dedicated directors, counselors, and volunteers, has shepherded this work with unwavering faith and resilience. Their stories reflect grace under pressure, transforming heartbreak into hope and vulnerability into strength.

Today, as SALI looks forward to the next decade of service, its roots remain deep in the foundational belief that *every life matters* and that **no woman should feel alone in choosing life**. With Life Centers across Europe and partnerships that extend into local communities in the U.S., the ministry stands as a testament to what can be accomplished when **faith is put into action** and love leads the way.

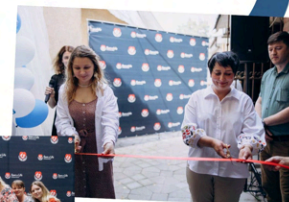

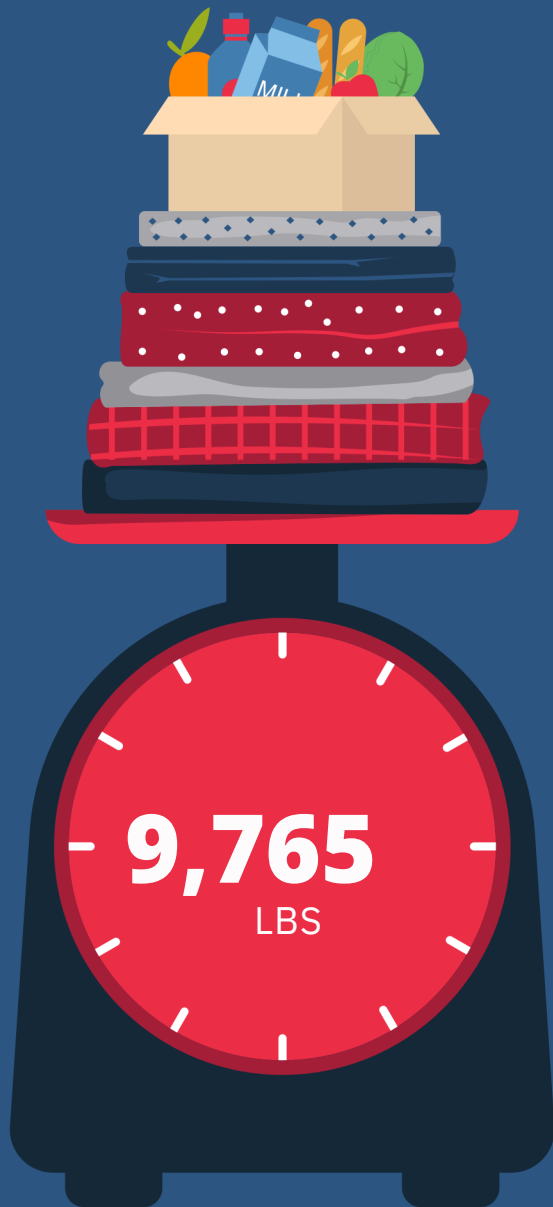

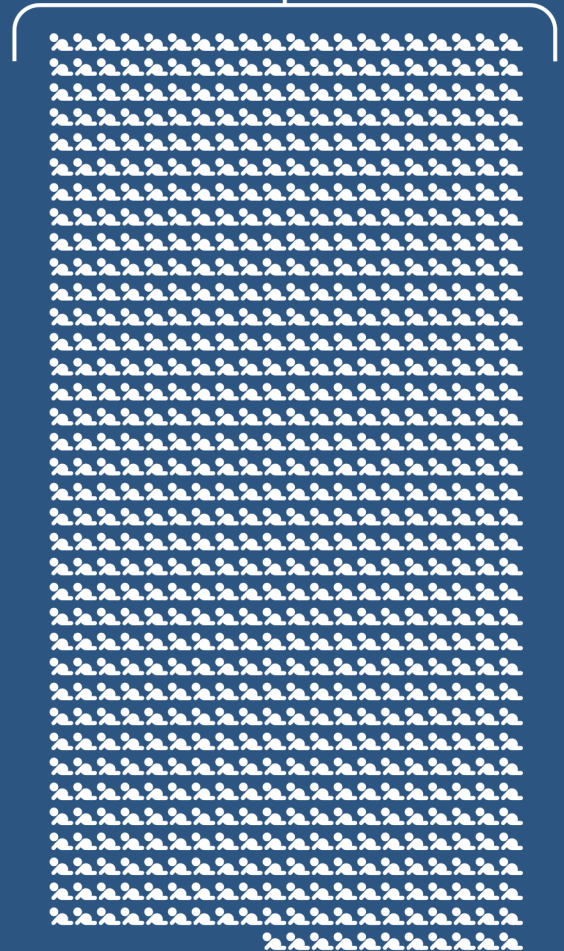
Pounds of Clothing & Food Distributed in Ukraine (U.S. & Europe Donations)

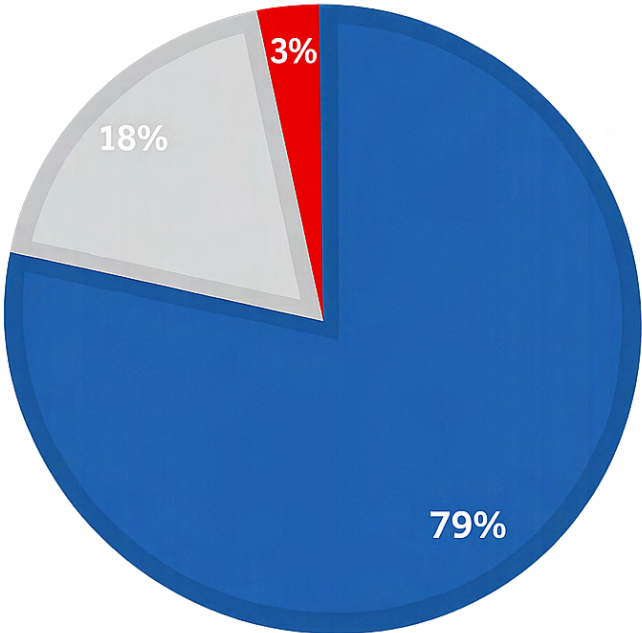

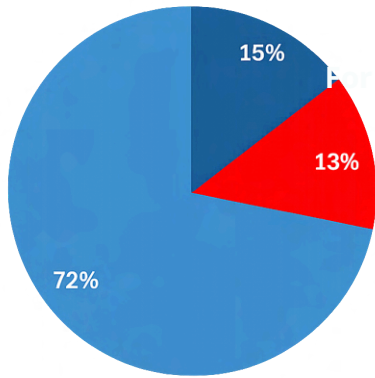

Distribution of Expenses



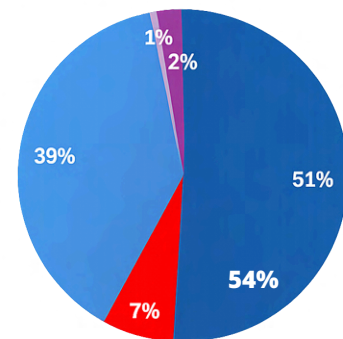

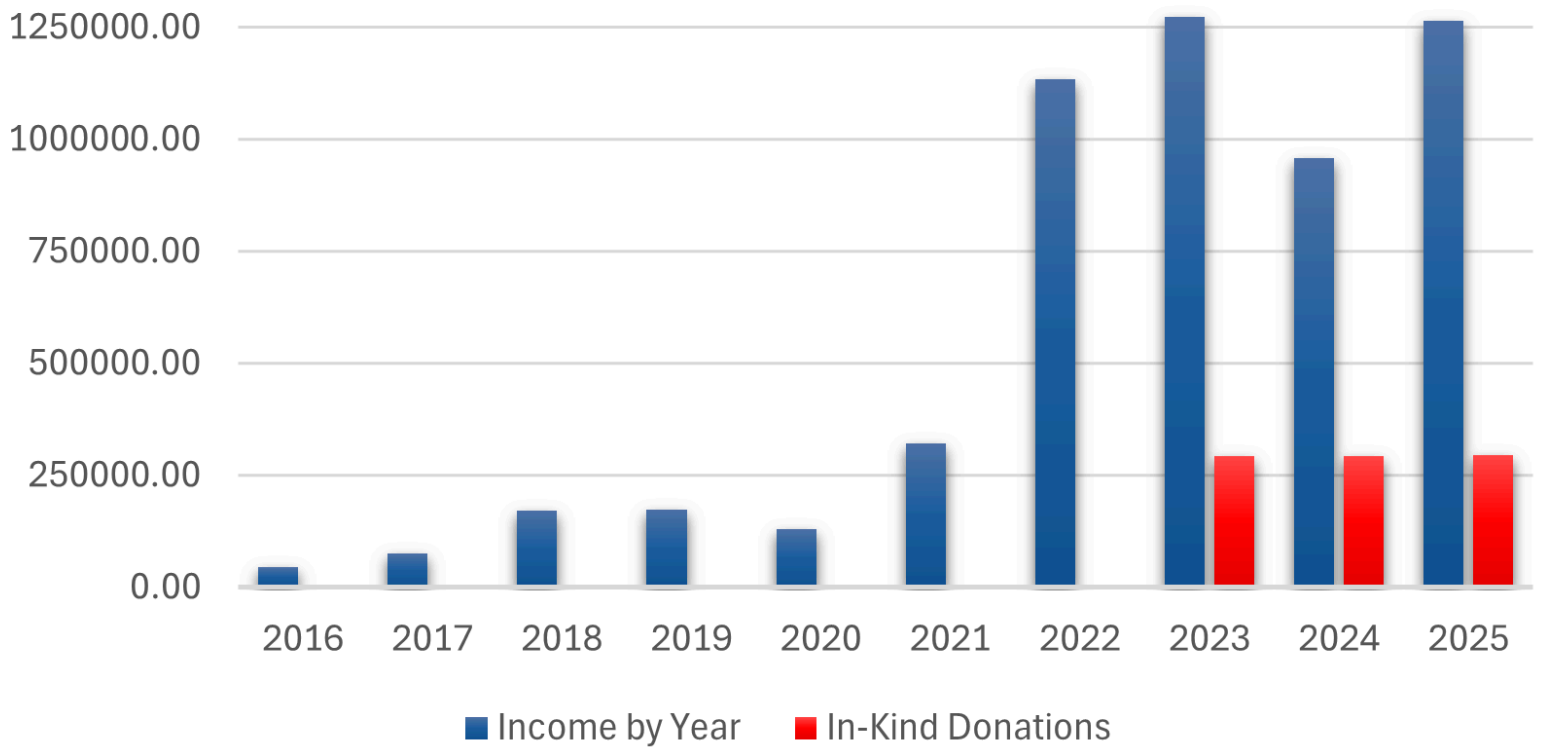
